

**Notice of Public Hearing**  
**Housing Element of the General Plan**

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that a Public Hearing will be held by the Bellflower City Council to discuss all reports, studies and testimony relative to the amendment and adoption of the Housing Element of the General Plan and related Negative Declaration. The Public Hearing will be held on Monday, November 10, 2003, at 7:00 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers, 16600 Civic Center Drive, Bellflower, California.

The City's current Housing Element was certified by HCD in 1994. This is an update to the City's existing Housing Element as required by law to be completed every five years. Various sections of the Housing Element including housing trends, city zoning mechanisms, housing constraints will be addressed.

Pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), a Negative Declaration means a written statement describing why a proposed project will not have a significant adverse effect on the environment and which may propose measures that avoid all possible adverse effects. A negative declaration has been prepared for this project.

Copies of materials are available and may be reviewed by the public in the Planning Division, City Hall, 16600 Civic Center Drive, Bellflower, California. Notification 48 hours prior to the meeting will enable the City to make reasonable arrangements to ensure accessibility to this hearing.

If you wish to challenge this matter in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the Public Hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City at or prior to the Public Hearing.
