

## The Department of Public Works Annually Accomplishes...

- *The trimming of approximately 4,500 trees and the planting of 100 new ones.*
- *The City Wide construction of sidewalk, driveway approaches, and curb and gutter.*
- *The City Wide construction of handicapped approach ramps to increase disabled citizen access.*
- *Cleaning and clearing the City's 174 storm drain catch basins, thereby decreasing pollutants reaching the ocean.*
- *Continuing a 7-day a week, 24 hour response graffiti removal program.*
- *Placing over 1,500 tons of slurry seal on various local streets as part of a seven-year maintenance cycle in order to maintain the City's street system in top quality.*
- *Responding to over 1,5000 requests for service.*
- *Continually looking for new greening and landscape project areas to beautify the City's public spaces.*

## An Introduction to Public Works

The Department of Public Works of the City of Bellflower is responsible for the management, coordination, and maintenance of the City's infrastructure and facilities. The Department is divided into three (3) divisions: Administration, Facilities, and Streets.

The Streets Division maintains and repairs City-owned streets, alleys, parking lots, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, traffic signals, traffic signage, street legend painting, curb painting, street striping, storm drain system, reclaim water system, sanitary sewer system, and bridges. It also includes services such as street sweeping and graffiti removal.

The Facilities Division maintains and repairs every aspect of each city facility including landscape irrigation systems, plumbing, electrical, air conditioning, heating, janitorial, carpentry, and painting.

The Administration Function includes department management, the City Engineer and support Staff.
