## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

This action would authorize the City to submit City/County Payment Program (CCPP) applications to the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) for the next five years.

## **RECOMMENDATION TO THE CITY COUNCIL**

- 1) Adopt Resolution No. 16-XX; or
- 2) Alternatively, discuss and take other action related to this item.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**

The City's will receive CCPP funding of approximately \$20,000 for Fiscal Year 2015/2016.

## **BACKGROUND**

The California Beverage Container Recycling and Litter Reduction Act requires the State of California to provide funding to local governments, if available, for beverage container recycling and litter cleanup activities. CalRecycle administers the CCPP to fulfill the requirements of the Act. The CCPP funds are used by the City to implement the Used Beverage Container Recycling Program.

To be eligible for the funds, the City must electronically submit a CCPP application to CalRecycle by June 1, 2016. The attached Resolution, which is also due to CalRecycle by June 1, 2016, will authorize the City to submit CCPP applications for the next five years.

The CCPP funds will be used to educate the community about beverage container recycling and litter prevention through the implementation of various programs. Current and previous programs include making presentations at local elementary schools, conducting the elementary school recycling artwork contest, producing the annual community recycling awareness calendar, and distributing recycling educational materials at various City events.

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SUBMITTAL OF A  
CITY/COUNTY PAYMENT PROGRAM APPLICATION TO  
THE DEPARTMENT OF RESOURCES RECYCLING AND  
RECOVERY**

**THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1.** The City Council finds and declares as follows:

- A. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Sections 48000 et seq., 14581, and 42023.1(g), the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) has established various payment programs to make payments to qualifying jurisdictions;
- B. In furtherance of this authority, CalRecycle is required to establish procedures governing the administration of the City/County Payment Program; and
- C. CalRecycle's procedures for administering the City/County Payment Program require, among other things, an applicant's governing body to declare by resolution certain authorizations related to the administration of the City/County Payment Program.

**SECTION 2.** The City Council of the City of Bellflower hereby authorizes the submittal of a City/County Payment Program application to CalRecycle and the City Manager, or his duly appointed representative, as agent of the City, is hereby authorized and empowered to execute, on behalf of the City, all documents, including, but not limited to, applications, agreements, annual reports (including expenditure reports), and amendments necessary to secure said payments to support the City's Used Beverage Container Recycling Program.

**SECTION 3.** This authorization is effective for five (5) years after the date of adoption of this Resolution.

**SECTION 4.** This Resolution does not affect any penalty, forfeiture, or liability incurred before, or preclude prosecution and imposition of penalties for any violation occurring before, this Resolution's effective date. Any such amended part will remain in full force and effect for sustaining action or prosecuting violations occurring before the effective date of this Resolution.

**SECTION 5.** If any part of this Resolution or its application is deemed invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the City Council intends that such invalidity will not affect the effectiveness of the remaining provisions or applications and, to this end, the provisions of this Resolution are severable.

**SECTION 6.** To the extent that any other resolution pertaining to a City/County Payment Program application to the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery is incorporated into this Resolution, it is superseded in its entirety.

**SECTION 7.** The Mayor, or presiding officer, is hereby authorized to affix his signature to this Resolution signifying its adoption by the City Council of the City of Bellflower, and the City Clerk, or her duly appointed deputy, is directed to attest thereto.

**SECTION 8.** This Resolution will become effective immediately upon adoption.
